

Network Joint Statement on SDGs for PFII16 May 4

I am giving the statement on the behalf of the Document Information Network for Indigenous peoples Sustainability

We affirm Indigenous Peoples right to negotiate our Free Prior and Informed Consent to development in Article 3 and many subsequent Articles of UNGA Resolution 61/295, the Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples. We therefore recommend:

1. that the UN take the opportunity of HLPF on the 2030 Agenda to educate Member States about Indigenous Peoples' understanding of negotiation and Free Prior and Informed Consent.
2. Ask the PFII to study Indigenous Peoples' sustainability achievements and share best practices for negotiating Indigenous Peoples' Free Prior and Informed Consent so we can share our sustainability achievements while respecting human rights.
3. Effectively implement the Convention on Transnational Organized Crime (CTOC), UN Convention Against Corruption, UN Convention Against Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances, and related conventions in the context of the 2030 Agenda by working directly with affected Indigenous Peoples' governments to report directly to these Treaty Committees. We call on GA to have Indigenous Peoples' representatives liaison with UN Office on Drugs and Crime. We ask GA to recommend to IMF to include Indigenous Peoples' representatives as liaison with its Financial Action Task Force (FATF) and related organizations.
4. Implement Goal 16 by developing direct communication between Member States and Indigenous Peoples to address corruption and increased militarization.
5. Protect water by prioritizing civilian access to water and ending the traffick of nuclear weapons material across our oceans and the pumping of toxins into rivers above and below ground.

Indigenous winds, lands, and waters are not 'natural capital' to be depleted. Our ecology is a system that we participate in and contribute to for the benefit of current and future generations. The ecosystem, when treated with respect,

regenerates. Participation in the ecosystem is not a zero end-sum game. It is a prayer in practice respecting our Mother Earth who nourishes us.

Indigenous Peoples are not to be targeted by the UN or Member States for sustainable development because we have already achieved sustainability. We ask for cooperation from the UN and Member States in sharing our sustainability achievements so we can mitigate and survive climate change together.
