Thank you Mr. Chairperson.

On behalf of my community Garo and organization Indigenous Peoples

Development Services from Bangladesh, I am pleased to make this statement

on agenda item 8.

The UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples is a living document

for the survival of indigenous peoples in the globe. The UNDRIP is the most

advanced Declaration on indigenous peoples' rights. It recognizes the wide

range of basic human rights and fundamental freedoms of indigenous peoples.

Among these are the right to self-determination, collective right to the

ownership, use and control of lands and natural resources.

Mr. Chairperson, the implementation of UN Declaration on the Rights of

Indigenous Peoples at country level is very important and challenging. As best

practice and strategy, organizing regular dialogue and consultation between

States, indigenous people's organizations, UN agencies, media and other key

stakeholders in promoting indigenous peoples' rights are useful. In my country

Bangladesh, engaging the Parliamentary Caucus on Indigenous Peoples and

National Human Rights Commission can bring a positive result implementing

the UNDRIP.

To fully realize the goals of the Declaration, governments need to commit and provide the foundation for partnership, mutual respect, cooperation and good faith between States and indigenous peoples.

We feel that as a strategy it is important to recognize the rights of indigenous peoples, which is developed with the effective participation of indigenous peoples based on the principle of free, prior and informed consent.

Finally, I recommend EMRIP to encourage States to promote capacity-building for indigenous peoples and to strengthen indigenous peoples' Institutions, non-governmental organizations and self-government structures. A special budget for the development of indigenous peoples is essential to attain the goals of the Declaration at country level.
