Sir:-

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your letter of August 28th.

You will remember that on August 14th, in reply to your request that the question which interests you should be brought to the notice of the League of Nations, I had the honour to inform you that I had no authority to do so except at the request of a member of the League.

With regard to the request for information on different points contained in your letter under reply, I have to inform you that the communication by the Secretariat of information concerning any correspondence between members of the League is subject to the same condition. Should such correspondence form the subject of discussion by the Council or the Assembly, it is of course published in the official records of the procedure of those bodies.

I much regret, therefore, to be unable to give the information for which you ask. I am confident that you will understand that to act otherwise would not be in order for the Secretariat of the League,
