The systematic Israeli attempts to alter the legal, demographic, and cultural characteristics of Jerusalem infringe on the inalienable social, economic, and cultural rights of the indigenous Palestinian population,

who are constantly being pushed out of the occupied City.

The historical and unique status of Jerusalem as a hub for different religions and traditions is an integral

part of the rich Palestinian cultural identity. The Israeli government, in collusion with the settler

movement, is targeting ancient archaeological and heritage sites in the occupied Palestinian territory,

including in occupied East Jerusalem, resulting in their appropriation, damage, or destruction. They are

trying to impose a Jewish-only narrative, as a pretext to facilitate the erasure of Palestinian identity and

the theft of more Palestinian land and resources through further forced displacement and illegal

settlement construction.

As an occupying power, Israel is obligated under international humanitarian law and international

human rights law to respect Palestinian cultural rights and protect Jerusalem's historical heritage sites.

We urge the expert to closely examine and report on Israel's violations in this regard as we urge the

international community to protect the indigenous Palestinians in occupied Jerusalem, and elsewhere

across historical Palestine, and stop Israeli colonial activities that aim to erase the indigenous Palestinian

identity and narrative, to ensure that their right to self-determination is fulfilled.
