## INTERVENTION OF AOTEAROA INDIGENOUS RIGHTS TRUST

## **READ BY TRACEY CASTRO WHARE**

Good afternoon.

We have two recommendations for the EMRIP to consider.

First that the EMRIP undertake a study on Indigenous peoples' permanent sovereignty over natural resources, or self determination or access to justice. We note that calls for a report on self determination have been made before but given its significance for the relationship between States and Indigenous peoples, we believe a continual call for a report on this important right is critical and necessary.

Secondly, that the EMRIP include in its agenda for its 6<sup>th</sup> session the World Conference on Indigenous Peoples and that a further interactive dialogue on the implementation of the Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples also be included.

Lastly, we note that last year the EMRIP recommendation on a report theme was not adopted by the Human Rights Council and that States suggested another topic. This was a disappointing outcome. It undermines the mandate that the Human Rights Council has given to the EMRIP and shows a lack of respect by States for the deliberations and consensus reached between the expert members of the EMRIP. We do not want to see such a practice continue and urge States to support the recommendations issued by the EMRIP.
