Statement of Japan

First of all, Japan appreciates the informative presentation made by Mr. Martinez, Chair of the Human Rights Council Advisory Committee; Mr. Henriksen, Chair of the Expert Mechanism on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples; and Ms. McDougall, Independent Expert on Minority Issues, as well as the report made earlier by H.E. Dr. Burayzat, Chair of the Social Forum. We look forward to these mechanisms' future efforts aimed at the protection and promotion of human rights.

Regarding the Advisory Committee that has held two sessions thus far, we appreciate members of the Committee for actively working on the tasks with which they were entrusted by the Human Rights Council.

Japan expects that the Advisory Committee will make a useful contribution to the Human Rights Council by working effectively on a variety of human rights issues, in keeping with Resolution 5/1 of the Human Rights Council. From this perspective, we expect discussion on how best to consider the recommendations of the Advisory Committee at the Council level will be conducted, taking into full account the structural change from the Human Rights Commission to the Advisory Committee of this Council.
