

Second International Decade of the World's Indigenous People (2005-2014)

-Proclaimed by the General Assembly (A/RES/59/174)

-Coordinator: Under-Secretary on Social and Economic Affairs - DESA



Objetives of the Decade:

- Promoting non-discrimination and inclusion;
- Promoting full and effective participation;
- Promoting development policies that are culturally appropriate, including respect for the cultural and linguistic diversity of indigenous peoples;
- Adopting targeted policies, programmes, projects and budgets for the development of indigenous peoples;
- Developing strong monitoring mechanisms and enhancing accountability at the international, regional and particularly the national level.

i. Small Grants Programme

Aims and Objectives

- ✓ Provides financial support to indigenous peoples initiatives
- ✓ Capacity-building and empowerment
- √ Focus on policy processes
- ✓ Local, national and global reach
- ✓ Grant size: maximum US\$10,000
- ✓ Maximum implementation period: one year
- ✓ The Permanent Forum Bureau acts as the Advisory Group for the Programme



External evaluation found that:

- The programme has enabled indigenous peoples from around the world to realize their own priorities for development by influencing policies or policy processes that affect them.
- It has been a success in terms of outreach and a major contribution to policy development and implementation.

ii. Trust Fund for the support of Permanent Forum members

Aims and objectives of the Trust Fund on Indigenous Issues

- ✓ supports representation and participation of the Permanent Forum members at international meetings significant to the Forum's mandates;
- ✓ supports the Forum in implementing its mandate to prepare and disseminate information about indigenous peoples;
- ✓ raise awareness and promote the integration and coordination of activities related to indigenous peoples;
- ✓ specific logistical support to the annual session.

Key challenge for the Trust Fund:

 Fewer resources for Permanent Forum members' representation – potentially less participation and exposure of the Permanent Forum



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


Overview of projects funded based on thematic areas 2006-2014
