Indigenous peoples traditional livelihoods and traditional occupations have been affected and continue to be affected by removal of Indigenous peoples from their land & traditional landscapes.

The forced removal ~~by diverse~~ from traditional lands/ancestral territories have weakened Indigenous peoples strategies for survival during disasters.

The dispossession of lands ~~has~~ for other uses such militarisation of pasture lands, conservation, extractive industries have reduced lands and weakened strategies for coping ~~for~~ mechanism ~~is~~ during times of disasters.

In Africa, the lifestyle of Pastoralists and hunter gatherer have been affected by Land dispossession to level that mobility of Indigenous <sup>peoples</sup> and their livestock.

The impact of extractive industries on traditional livelihood has led to serious reduction of pasture lands that pastoralist

In Kenya, During droughts pastoralists are ~~just~~ given relief food ~~as~~ that lead to dependency, with very little done to rebuild their <sup>their</sup> livelihood. Government want to convert pastoralists to be agriculturalists there is need to strengthen community based disaster reduction at the community level and enable communities continue their livelihoods based on their livelihoods.
