ha? I sləx il, tsicyaltsa tsi sda. tul? al čəd dx ilap. Good afternoon, My name is Deborah Parker. My traditional family name is tsicyaltsa. I am a citizen of the Tulalip Tribes located on our ancestral territory near the Coast Salish Sea. I am also a citizen of the United States.

On behalf of indigenous women organizations which presented, "Towards Beijing 25: Combatting all Forms of Violence Against Indigenous women", we recommend a future thematic study focused on the atrocities of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women in North America and around the world. Indigenous women and girls have been publicly devalued, ignored and murdered at high rates and this must be studied and understood. This violence must end.

We know that missing and murdered indigenous women and girls is an ongoing act of genocide. The Expert Mechanism must examine the underlying historical, environmental, social, economic, cultural, and institutional causes of abuse that contribute to the pervasive and destructive violence against indigenous nations. This is a crime against humanity.
